Minutes of the Public Hearing & Special Meeting of the Alleghany County Water District Board of Directors Tuesday, March 22nd, 2016 Alleghany Firehouse, 105 Plaza Court Alleghany

Call to Order: 6:10 pm

Quorum Established: Present were directors Rae Bell, Madeleine Hamb, and Robbin DeWeese. Secretary Leslie Baker was present and took the minutes. ACWD staff present: Water Treatment Operator Bruce Coons, Water Distribution Assistant Eddy Snyder, Bookkeeper Edda Snyder and Meter Reader Bob Hale. Public present: Ernest & Nancy Finney, Faris Dolgoff, Bernice McLeod, Oregon Burns Tenney IV, Oregon Burns Tenney V, Kari Tenney, Tobyn Mehrmann, Carolyn Shultz, Rebecca Wilkerson, Venus Adams, Larry Vieira and Sierra County District Attorney Larry Allen.

The Public Hearing was opened at 6:13 p.m. by President Rae Bell

A letter written by Rebecca Wilkerson requesting the Board hold off on moving forward with the proposed rate change was read by Secretary Baker. The letter is attached to these minutes. After the letter was read, the President asked the Board if they wished to make a motion to postpone. No motion made. Two (2) questions on the letter were addressed as follows: #3 Yes, the three properties which are not part of the CRWA recommendation will be raised to \$40.00 a month. #4 No, multi-family residences will not be charged \$80 per month the rates are per meter or water service.

Rae Bell presented a rate projection using the new rates for three types of customers based on actual water usage over a period of 12 months. It showed that the average monthly rate increase would range from \$5.26 for low water users to \$15.58 for very high users. She mentioned that anybody could still withdraw their protest letter if they wished, nobody did.

While the protest letters were being tallied, questions were posed to the Board including:

A question about how leaks would affect billing: the answer was yes, leaks would result in a higher water bill. It was pointed out that the board is looking at adopting a water leak adjustment policy in conformance with how it has been done in the past. Another question was about the increase in a resident's water bill and how they would know that it would be consistent for the sake of budgeting. The answer was that the bill would not be exactly the same every month but based on their typical usage, their bill would go up approximately \$5 a month.

A question was posed considering multi-owner properties, and if the vote would be split if they disagreed. The answer was yes, there is one vote per service and it can be split between the two owners.

A question about the amount of rate increase was asked: right now I pay \$36 dollars for 12,000 gallons, how much would I pay for it with the rate increase? The answer was \$58.00.

Protest letters for the proposed rate change were tallied by Secretary Baker and Nancy Finney. The total tally of letters was 24, which was not enough to overturn the proposed rate change (31 were needed).

Robbin made a Motion to accept the official count of protest letters, Madeleine second: ayes unanimous.

The Public Hearing was brought to a close at 6:40 p.m., and the Special Meeting started at the same time.

New Business:

Applications for appointment to the two vacant Board seats were considered from two applicants: Oregon Burns Tenney V & Tobyn Mehrmann. Their statements of qualification were considered and the Board voted unanimously to affirm their appointment. They were sworn in by District Attorney Larry Allen.

Old Business:

Policy #4 conflict of interest item was addressed. Kari Tenney requested an update on the status of the conflict of interest accusation made on January 26th. Rae Bell reported that she will be requesting a formal opinion from the Fair Political Practices commission. Kari also asked if Rae Bell owned stock in the Sixteen-to-One Mine and Rae confirmed that she and her husband do own approximately 13,000 shares although the value is difficult to determine. There was also a question about the annual filing of the form 700's and it was explained that they are due on April 1st of each year for the previous calendar year. They are submitted to the county annually.

A motion was made by Robbin, seconded by Madeleine to accept the updated conflict of interest code. Ayes: Arbogast, DeWeese, Hamb Nayes: Mehrmann, Tenney 0 Absent, 0 Abstain, 0 Vacant. Motion passed.

Alleghany County Water District (ACWD) Policies & Procedures

Policy #3 Alleghany County Water District Conflict of Interest Code

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Section 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. It can be incorporated by reference and may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission after public notice and hearings to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference and, along with attached Appendix A in which members of the Board of Directors and employees are designated, and in which disclosure categories are set forth, constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Alleghany County Water District.

Each action taken by a Board member and/or employee in the course of their duties will be motivated by the District's best interests and will be free of outside influence and self interests. In addition, board members shall not in any way directly or indirectly financially benefit from any aspect of the district's operations.

In accordance with this policy, Board and employees shall comply with the following:

- 1. Board members must abstain from voting on any action in which they have a financial interest.
- 2. No board member shall accept any remuneration in money or services from the district, except as allowed for by Government Code Section 30507.
- 3. Board members and employees, as described in Appendix A of the Alleghany County Water District conflict of interest code shall file a Statement of Economic Interests, Form 700 annually by April 1st with the Clerk of the County of Sierra who shall retain copies and make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction. (Gov. Code section 81008).

Attached to this memo are three comparisons based on actual usage data comparing the new rate proposal to the current rates. All comparisons are based on the \$36 residential rate.

Actual usage figures are rounded UP for the purposes of this comparison AND I used the previous fiscal year's data which had higher average water use than this year.

To summarize the results:

1 adult with a small garden: average monthly increase in water bill \$ 5.26 2 adults with a small garden: average monthly increase \$ 9.42

Family of four with large garden: average monthly increase \$15.58
